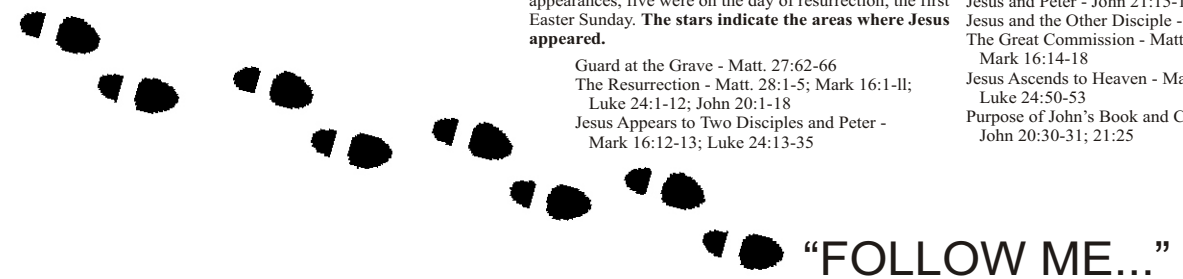


Period of Resurrection

The events during the forty days between Resurrection and Jesus' Ascension cannot be arranged in journeys as Jesus just appeared and disappeared at will. Of the ten recorded appearances, five were on the day of resurrection, the first Easter Sunday. **The stars indicate the areas where Jesus appeared.**

- **Final journey, A.D. 58-63.**
 Taken prisoner in Jerusalem by Rome in A.D. 58 and was taken to Caesarea where he remained a prisoner for two years. Courtesy of Rome, he was taken to Sidon, Myra, Cnidus, Fair Havens on Crete. After leaving Crete they hit stormy weather and were finally ship-wrecked on the island of Malta (Melita) where they stayed for three winter months. From Malta to Syracuse, Rhegium, Puteoli, Forum on the Appian Way, Three Taverns and finally Rome.
